UNESCO WEEK 2024/25 International Symposium:

Sustainable Communities for a Sustainable Future Concept Note and Programme

1. Background

In recent years, global call for sustainable development has grown louder, as environmental degradation, climate change and social inequalities continues to pose significant challenges. Addressing these interconnected issues requires innovative solutions that go beyond traditional approaches and involve collective action across various sectors. In this endeavor, there is no doubt that communities play a critical role in shaping sustainable futures, but their efforts must be supported by collaborative frameworks that transcend borders and disciplines.

In 2020, Japan's Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) launched the UNESCO Future Co-Creation Platform project, aimed at promoting multi-dimensional sustainability across generational, regional, and organizational levels through UNESCO-related activities. This project adopts an international and collaborative approach, fostering cooperation between various sectors and countries while involving stakeholders and experts from diverse academic and practical fields. By building a network of like-minded stakeholders from Japan and beyond and offering a platform for knowledge exchange and dialogue, grassroots activities in the area of UNESCO can be strategically enhanced and expanded, ultimately contributing to a more promising and sustainable future for all.

The primary objective of the symposium is to explore and promote innovative strategies that empower individuals and institutions working at the community level to engage in effective cross-sectoral initiatives. By presenting global discussions on sustainability alongside a selection of relevant case studies, the symposium aims to inspire participants to take active roles in initiating and supporting collaborative efforts that drive sustainable community development in the fields of UNESCO.
